Challenge and objectives of the parallel session

A **SUMP** is an integrated and strategic plan designed to satisfy the mobility needs of people and businesses in cities and their surroundings for a better quality of life. It takes due consideration of integration, participation and evaluation principles

Rural proofing a SUMP is the process of systematic screening of both positive and negative, direct and indirect, intended and unintended impacts of urban mobility policies on rural territories and in all those living, working or visiting such areas.
